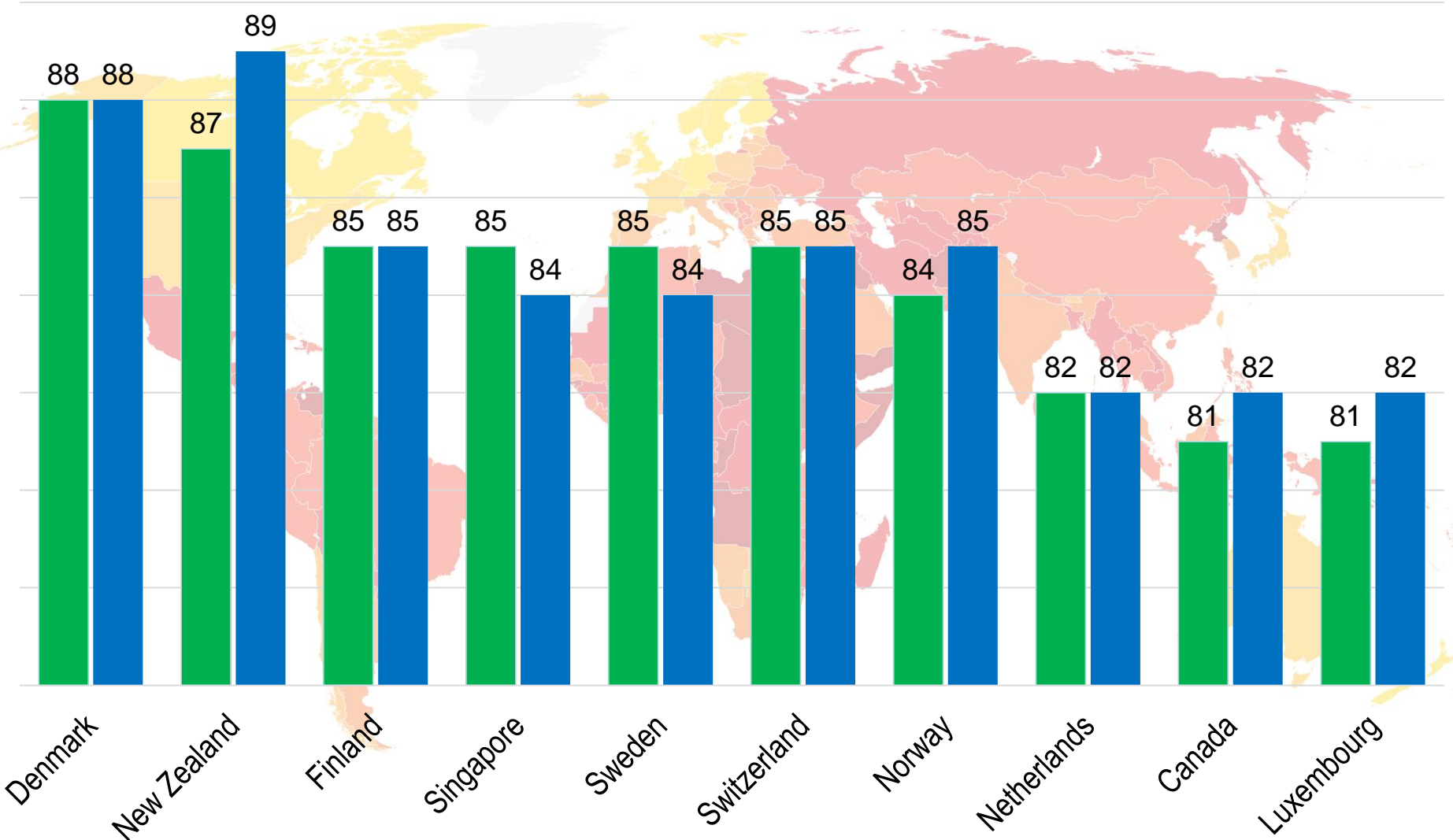

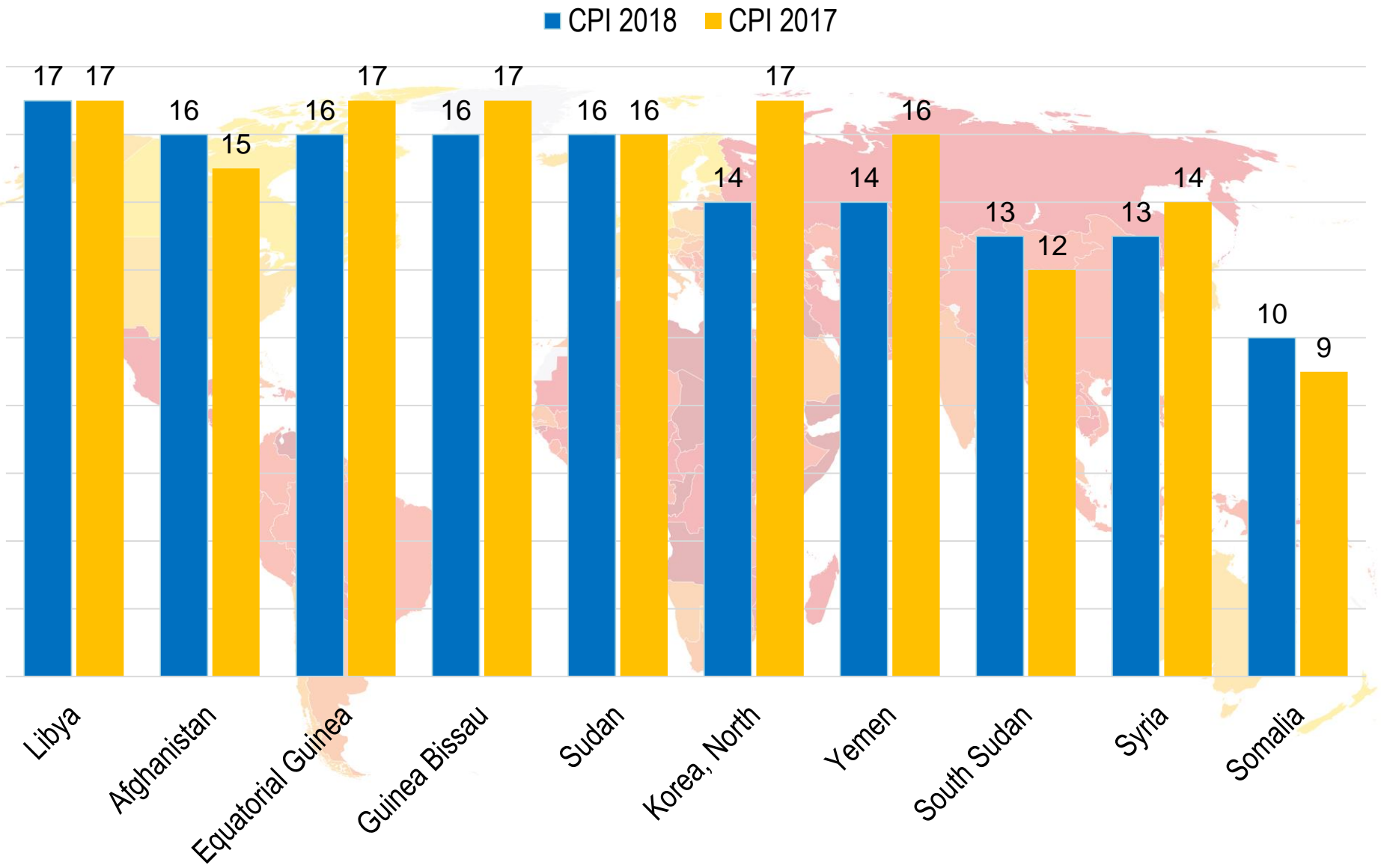

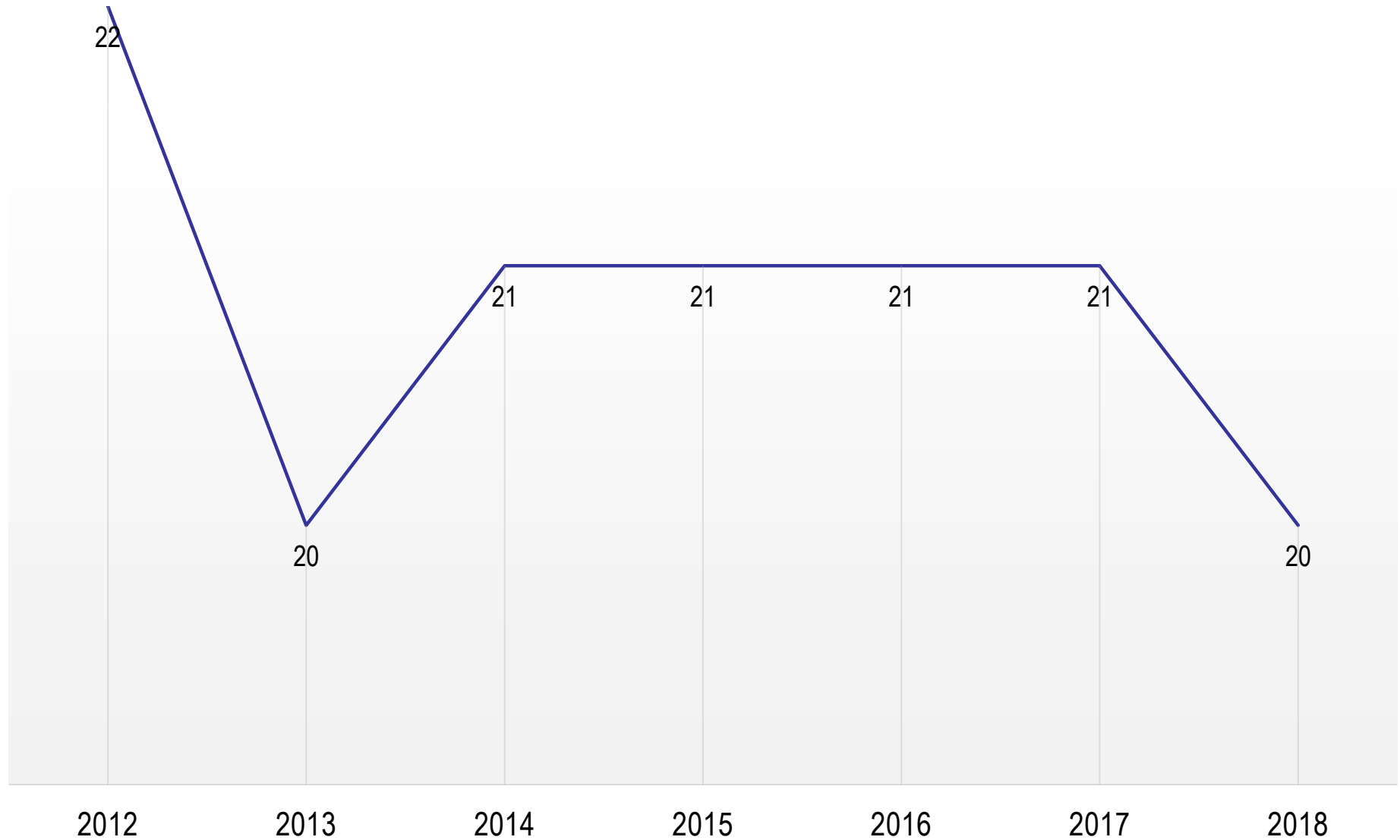
COMPARISON BOTTOM 10 (2018-2017)



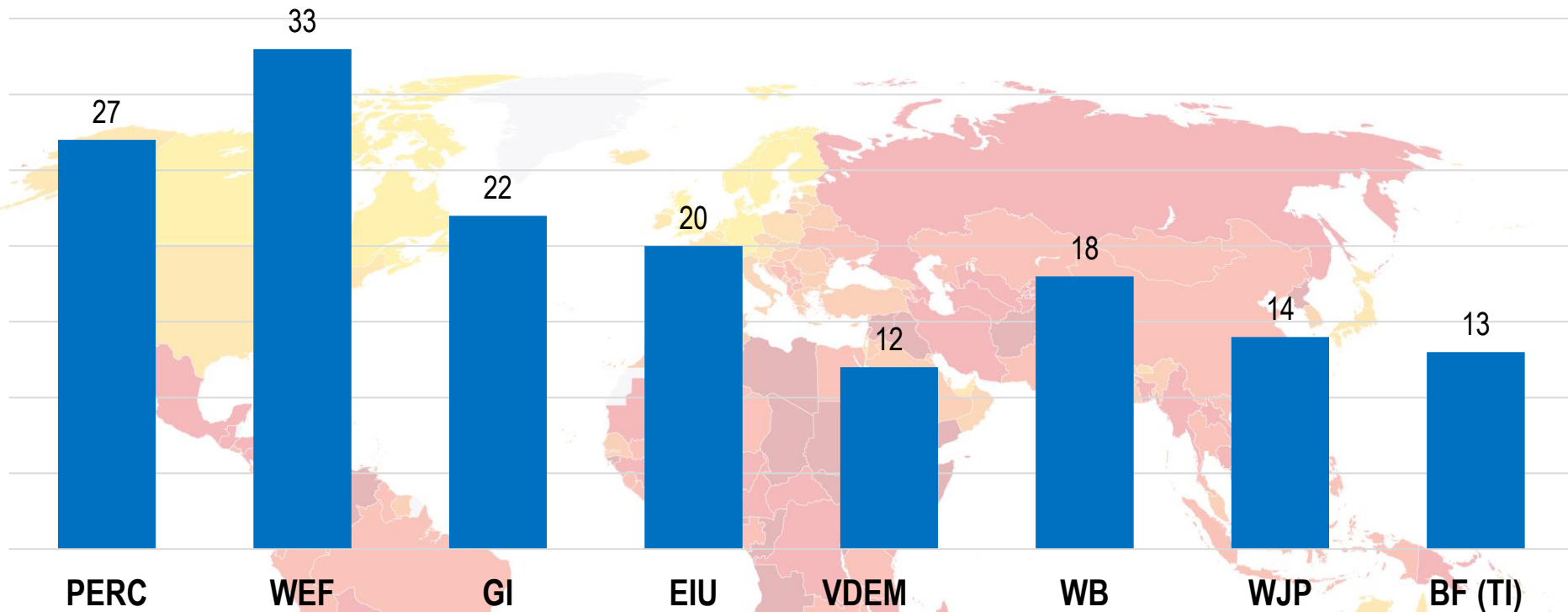
- 
- Cambodia receives **score of 20** in the CPI 2018 Index. In comparison to 2017, the score has dropped **1 point**.
 - Cambodia now ranks **161th out of the 180 countries/territories included** which remained the same as last year (161/180).

Continues to be perceived as **highly corrupt** and continues to occupy **the lowest spot in ASEAN and the third lowest in Asia Pacific Region.**

CAMBODIA'S CPI SCORES COMPARISON OVER THE YEARS (2012 – 2018)

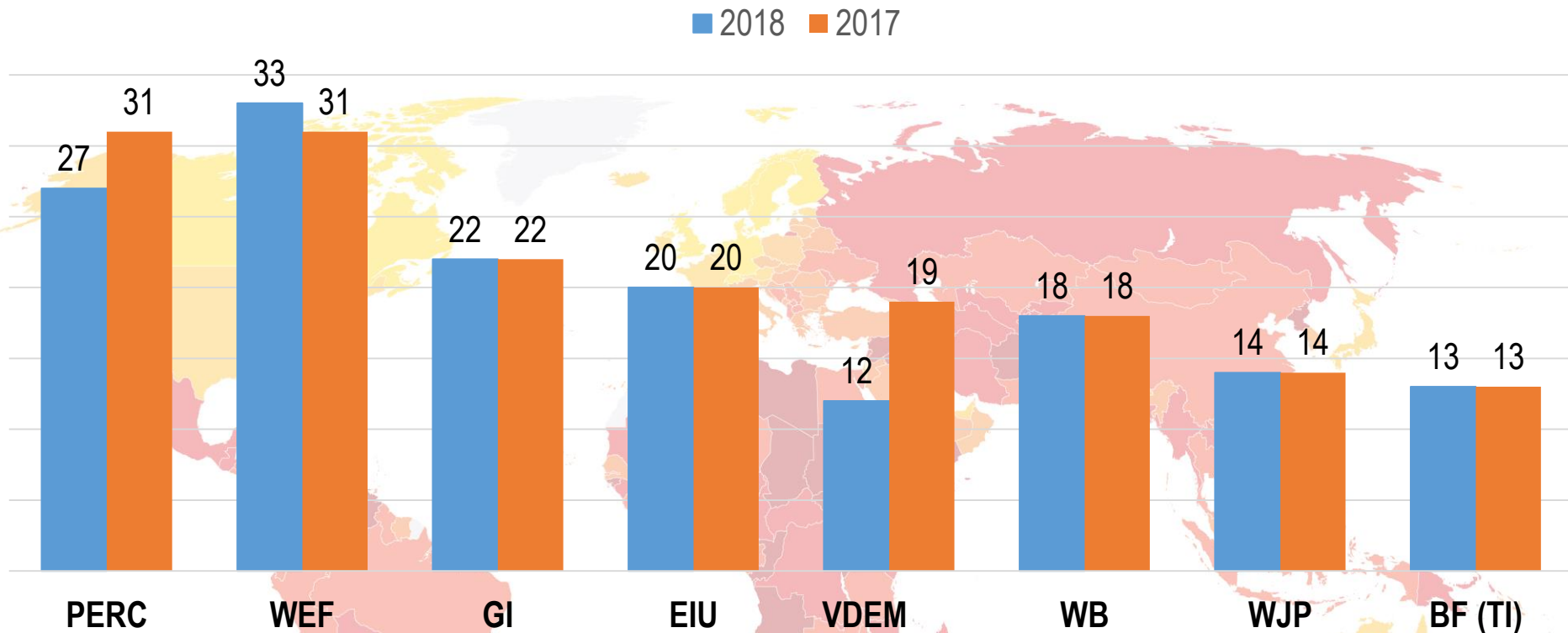

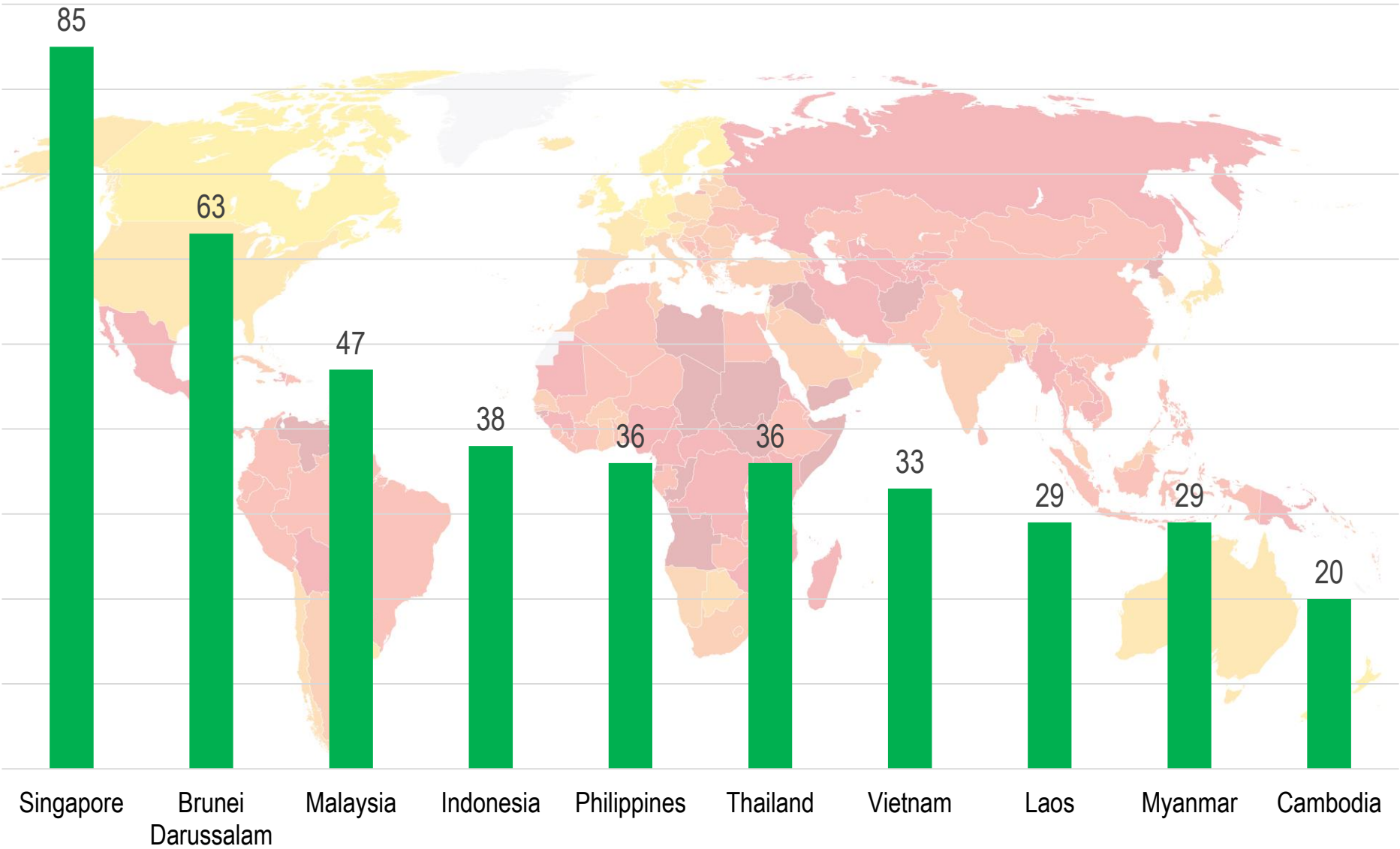

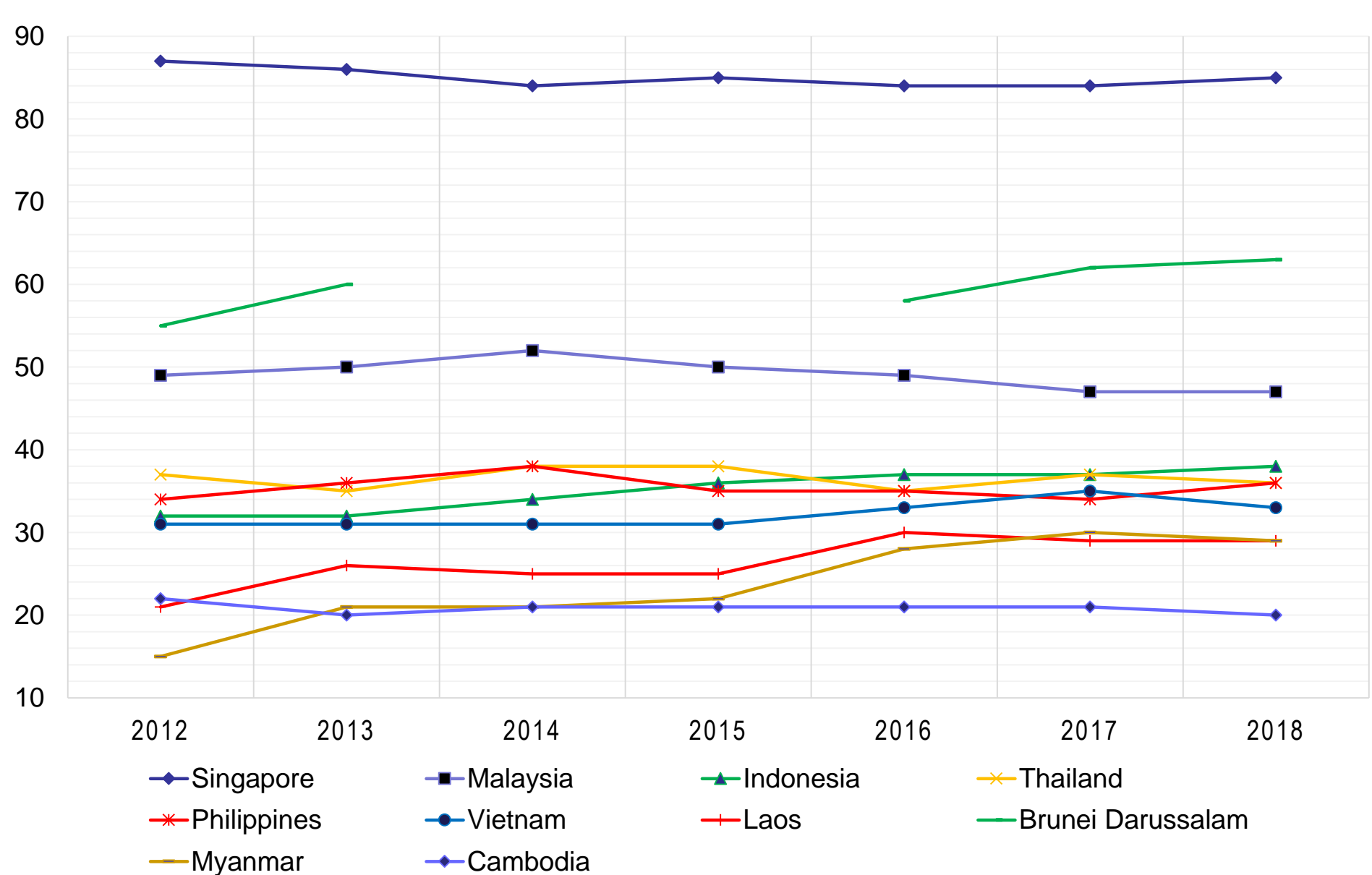

ASEAN COUNTRIES' CPI SCORES COMPARISON OVER THE YEARS



Key recommendations of TI Cambodia are:

1. Amend a number of articles of the anti-corruption law, especially with regard to asset declaration
2. Timely adopt regulations that promote citizens' access to public information and protect whistleblowers
3. Strengthen the institutions responsible for promotion of rule of law and addressing the implementation gap between anti-corruption legislation, practice and enforcement
4. Enable active participation of CSOs and media to participate in the fight against corruption
5. Establish accountability mechanisms, check and balance at both national and sub-national levels
6. Foster the culture of integrity, transparency and accountability across all spectrum of the society.
